COVID-19 Safety Procedures

Updated: September 3, 2020

The Cibolo Nature Center & Farm is taking COVID-19 procedures seriously to maintain the health and safety of our staff, volunteers and program participants. Below is a list of our measures we are doing to minimize risk and provide safe and healthy programs. If you have questions, please contact laurie@cibolo.org for more details or information.

Training- All staff and volunteers leading programs will take the Texas A&M AgriLife COVID-19 childcare considerations and disinfecting procedures, online classes, before their 1st day of work.

Pre-Screening- All staff, volunteers, and program participants will have temperature checks and a symptom screening before teaching programs each day. Program participants will be required to have their parents or guardians, group leader or teachers sign off on a pre-screening form. Temperature checks will be taken by appointed staff, and any participant with a fever of 100 degrees or higher will result in automatic program participant, staff or volunteer dismissal.

Masks- In accordance with the state of Texas mandate, masks are required by anyone ages ten and up, when a person is 6 feet or closer to another person. When working 6 ft or farther from another person outside doing physical labor, hiking, or gardening, you may remove your mask. Program participants with health concerns that would prevent them from following this safety standard need to let the CNC & F Staff know immediately. Staff, volunteers or program participants having to enter a building for any reason must wear a mask. Mask must cover the mouth and nose.

Disinfectant Procedures- Staff will have rigorous disinfectant procedures for programs, following the guidelines set out by the CDC.

Handwashing Procedures- Staff will wash their hands often, following CDC guidelines.

Program Check-in- Drop-off program participants will be temperature checked, and health screened upon entering the CNC & F property. Family members, guardians not attending the program, siblings may only be allowed to enter the program if health checked by CNC staff.

Quarantine- If a staff member, volunteer, or program participant develops symptoms of COVID-19 during a program and cannot leave immediately, they will be quarantined until picked up on site in our designated spaces.

Contact with COVID-19 If you or someone you are close to has contact with someone with COVID-19 or is being tested for COVID-19, please report this to the program staff or director immediately.

COVID-19 updates- We follow the guidelines set out by the CDC, the state and local government and health administrations, and as guidelines change, our procedures will be updated.
