



CIBOLO NATURE CENTER & FARM PHOTO PERMIT RULES

A photo permit is required to take photos at the Cibolo Nature Center or Herff Farm.

\$50.00 - 10-30 GUESTS

FILM PERMITS AVAILABLE

PHOTO PERMIT RULES

A photo permit is required for amateur portrait & all professional photography. This includes any sessions that use professional cameras, reflectors, tripods or costumes. You may purchase a permit online at www.cibolo.org or inside the Visitor Center during business hours at the Cibolo Nature Center. Permits start at \$20. Professional photographers may also wish to become a Natural Partner of the Cibolo Nature Center & Farm! For an annual fee of \$250, you will have unlimited access to our grounds and also be listed on our website as one of our special community partners.

When you purchase a photo permit online for the Nature Center, you are welcome to call us to be sure that no other events are scheduled during the time you plan to visit. When purchasing the permit at the Visitor Center a receipt will be issued to you. Photo permits for Herff Farm are limited to outside sessions Saturdays 9am – 1pm, or by special appointment.

Your purchase of a photo permit benefits the Cibolo Nature Center & Farm mission of promoting conservation of natural resources through education and stewardship, so thank you for your purchase.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:

What happens if I don't purchase a photo permit?

You will likely be approached and asked to purchase a permit on site

But, I have a personal camera - I'm not a professional.

If costumes, tripods, reflectors or staged photography is involved you will likely be approached - and this will only benefit the Nature Center & Farm!!

What if the photo session is scheduled outside Visitor Center hours at the Nature Center?

Please purchase your permit online and carry your receipt with you. To pay at the CNC, please attach your business card to \$20 cash or check and deposit into the secure donation box at the park entrance in the Oak Mott when you are ready to leave.

Do I need to schedule the shoot at the Nature Center?

Not necessarily, but when you call we will tell you of any planned events scheduled on the property. We can also tell you of more/less busy times to visit the Nature Center that will help make your photo shoot successful.

Do I need to schedule the shoot at the Herff Farm?

The Herff Farm location is only available for outdoor photo sessions Saturdays from 9am to 1pm. Permits can be purchased online or at the Visitor tent at the Farm. You can make special arrangements for sessions at Herff Farm by calling 830-249-4616 to schedule an appointment.

What if I have several groups that I will shoot throughout the day?

Each group will require a permit

Who purchases the permit - the client or photographer?

Each photographer works differently, please consult your photographer. A permit is required for all photography sessions, professional or non-professional photographers.

Is there a military discount?

Not at this time

For large groups, do I need to pay additional?

Yes - permits are offered at \$20 & \$50 depending on the size of your group. For groups larger than 30, please call the Cibolo Nature Center & Farm for special arrangements.

How about filming?

Film permits are available. Call for more information.

May I use a credit card?

You may use a credit card online or in the Visitor Center for no additional charge.

Cibolo Nature Center & Farm Rules and Regulations:

NO Rice, Confetti, Flower Petals, Candy, Glitter, Cascarones or other like items are permitted.

NO candles, bonfires or any other type of open flame are permitted.

Dressing room areas are limited to public restrooms in the Pavilion or at the Visitor Center.

DO NOT pick flowers, break tree limbs, or disrupt natural habitats.

Take only pictures, leave only footprints.
